Tuesday 16th July,

En plein air Artist Dawn Jordan gave an oil demonstration to EAG members. Her photo is at the mouth of the Exe Estuary. She explained how she mixes her colours. It is best to prepare all the mixes before you begin your painting. She used blues & purples which are complimentary to

yellow & so make the sun pop in her painting. Dawn explained how using lights against darks, having a focal point, and composition are so important when planning your painting.

Begin by putting in silhouette shapes. Then begin to fill in your painting. Fine tune as you go along. Dots and dashes highlight a painting towards end.

Most difficult is to know when a painting finished - Dawn's suggestions when you feel your painting is finished.....

Check edges - Do they need softening

Brighter edges round focal point - Check tones

Stand back or use a mirror to check painting- Do colours still work together

Is the Perspective working - Check composition - is the eye going round painting

Is there different thickness thinness of paint - Good to check it next day to see if needs refining

Oil paint pallet can be kept in the freezer to stop left over paint drying out A great learning and interesting experience for us all ending in a fabulous finished painting.

Dawn Jordon workshop

The following day we had the pleasure of attending Dawn's workshop, painting a Sunset Seascape in oils 'a la prima' (all in one go, whilst the paint is wet).



Dawn is an accomplished Artist and Business Woman having had a career as a college lecturer and owning her own fashion design business.

Dawn went onto study Art and Design at mid Cheshire College and Central Saint Martins College in London. She enjoys painting Seascapes, Landscapes and Woodland Scenes and painting in Acrylics and oils.

We all arrived full of enthusiasm following Dawn's demonstration the previous day and once we'd set up our 'Kit', we dived straight into our paintings.

We'd each bought our own photograph, with Dawn giving us help with our composition (advising us to have different proportions of total darks and total lights on the board). We started, by quickly sketching out our composition onto our boards with a paintbrush and diluted oil paint. We then went onto blocking in our colours to cover the board. Painting the sky and the foreground (sea) at the same time.

Dawn reminded us to mix up our pools of colour and to paint dark to light. To pay attention to perspective and advised us to paint the foreground (rocks) darker than the background (hills) and a mid tone for the buildings (mid ground). As our painting developed she advised us to take a break and stand back and look from a distance.

Towards the end Dawn shared with us her knowledge of painting the top layers and detail, how to hold and use the brush/palette knife and to use a lot of paint on either one so that the oil stuck to the surface without disturbing the underlying paint.

At the end we stood all our paintings together and admired everyone's achievements.

Thank you Dawn for a thoroughly lovely day painting! We all felt we'd learnt a great deal.

Thelma Hulbert - Talk\Demo Tuesday 20th August 2024 at the Sea Cadet Hall

THG is a public art gallery in Honiton and is run by <u>East Devon District Council</u> and supported by Arts Council England.

Tracey Rapson will talk about Thelma Hulbert as an artist and then give a bit of an introduction to the gallery, exhibitions – past and present, and engagement programme.

Printing Demonstration - Tuesday 2nd July

Lisa Murdock facilitated our meeting on Tuesday 2nd evening, introducing us to Print Making. Lisa explained the process of printmaking with examples of planographic techniques/
Screen Printing/Intaglio/Relief/Lino Mono Printing & Monotype. She demonstrated how to use stencils. She discussed the different types of paper & plates that can be used. She also advised the process of Lino cutting. Kits are available for those interested for most of these techniques. Lisa suggested using raised patterned wallpaper samples to make prints from. Lisa showed members how to use a Gelli plate. Lisa has supplied a few useful links for members to research further. We all had the opportunity to create & then print our own prints. Lisa had prepared all that we needed to do this & we had great fun doing this together.

Award-Winning Exmouth Art Group Members!

Two of our members (that we know of) bravely entered their artwork into the annual **SAA's Artist of the Year** exhibition earlier in 2024, and both have been awarded a **Highly Commended** accolade, having been short listed from over 1,900 entries!

Our very own **Cherry Ferris** and **Caroline Winyard** had to keep their wins a secret for a couple of weeks but now it is out in the open, we are delighted to share in their joy and offer congratulations on their individual achievements. Cherry, aka Fairiewood Art, is a full-time artist, tutor and allround creative, producing a wide range of pieces in different types of mediums. Cherry is also a contributing artist to the **SAA Paint & Create magazine** (check out the summer edition for her latest tutorial where she shows you how to create a kingfisher using a mixed media approach to pyrography on paper). She is also an associated artist with Ken Bromley and Derwent pencils and an author with Search Press. Cherry's winning piece in the competition was entitled "Reverence" and took 7 hours to create in acrylics with mixed media and is finished with oils. Cherry



explains that she "wanted to create a piece that would capture a feeling and a moment in time with element of whimsy and of respect for whoever you are. So, I decided to use an apex land predator and a dainty butterfly and played with balancing complementary colours (also opposites). I wanted to portray the feeling of awe and coexistence... No matter how big or small, we are all beautiful".

Caroline creates her artwork around her part-time role as the Fundraising Manager for local charity, the South West MS Centre. She sells her work at various exhibitions, offers commissions and pet portraits and delivers demonstrations and workshops to local art groups, showing her passions for animal artwork through pastels and pencils. Her competition entry, "Talk to the Wing" was created in Luminance coloured pencils on drafting film and features a squabble between a cardinal couple on a bird bath. Caroline explains "this piece was a delight to draw as I could just imagine what they might be saying to each other! I love how vibrant the birds are, particularly the male, and wanted to ensure this showed through in the artwork – using double-matt drafting film I could add pigment to the reverse side where I wanted to ramp up the intensity. I'm so thrilled to have been awarded a 'Highly Commended' in this national competition, and to be judged alongside such talented artists including Cherry". Both artists will be displaying their work with the winners and other shortlisted finalists at the special exhibition in Nottingham in October.
